Dear Bruce,

The purpose of this letter is to formally acknowledge your February 13th attendance at the OACP Board of Directors meeting in London, Ontario. You and your colleagues made a very compelling presentation on how a 'universal, fully integrated, reliable, cost-effective and prompt online system that could link the buyer and the spent shell case as a first step in locating that person shooting the weapon'. We appreciated learning how the Bullet ID system utilizes a patent pending process to laser-etch a unique bar code onto each brass cartridge case of a bullet and to the packaging, as part of the manufacturing process. The identifying code marking is then scanned on site and linked to a Bullet site that tracks the movement through the supply chain. Law enforcement subscribers can scan the code at a crime to lead them to the owner.

We agree with your statement that Bullet ID is not a gun registry but is an investigative tool at a crime scene which also affords inventory control methodology. Many of the Board members were very complimentary on the information package provided at the meeting.

Following your presentation, the Board unanimously passed a Motion: ***The OACP Board of Directors agree and support, in principle, a program that 'serialized bullets' should be the standard for manufacturers of ammunition.***

On behalf of the Board, I would again thank you for your presentation and we wish you all the success in your efforts with this unique program.
